VII. DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS

- A. Finance/Facilities/Community
 - 1. Discussion re: 2009-2010 Budget Update

Budget Subcommittee Chair Tim Hagen summarized the committee events over the past three weeks. Additional savings of \$300,000 have been identified leaving a shortfall of \$146,431 to reach the full reduction of \$446,431 for the 2009/2010 Budget. Bus transportation is being assessed for possible reductions. As a result of Adstaff deliberations, the original reduction of 7 teaching positions has been redistributed to 4.0 FTE at the high school, 2.65 FTE at the middle school, and .35 - .5 at the elementary level. If further staffing reductions are necessary, Adstaff recommends reducing elementary specials in the following priority; 1.0 FTE Global Language, 1.0 Elementary Music, and 1.0 Kindergarten Specials. This was based upon an alternative of increasing elementary class sizes, however serious unease in reducing elementary school specials was expressed. The lower number of hours of instruction per year at the elementary level, as compared with our DRG and the State, was also of concern. It was clarified that although the adjustment will allow for more daily time in core curriculum courses, the proposed course reductions will not result in increases in our instructional hours. Board members stressed the importance of maintaining Global Language, Elementary Music and Kindergarten Specials for educating the whole child. Dr. Smotas raised concern for the 2010/2011 Budget. He noted that difficult choices will be imperative, and he emphasized the importance of engaging the community in preparation for the next budget. The Board discussed ways to ensure better involvement in the capital budget process to include early identification of district needs, better communication with the Town, and becoming more proactive. Dr. Smotas recommended the Board request a seat on the Capital Budget Committee. The Referendum Vote is scheduled for Friday, May 22, 2009.
