HI. NEW BUSINESS

A. Goodwin Trail. Mr. Carlson met with Victor Benni, Town Engineer, who marked the parking area on Whistletown Road and Grassy Hill Road.

Mr. Carlson, Dick Raymond (State Forester) and Kevin Lacey walked Darrow Pond. The erosion is 3' deep. Water bars will be installed to stop the erosion.

Mr. Danila reported there will be a CACIWAC Meeting on November 12.

Mr. Carlson reviewed a map of the Goodwin Trail with Commission members. He stated the map will be on the kiosk. Mr. Carlson reported Yale has received a map.

Mr. Christensen reported at a Zoning Commission Meeting they approved COSTCO. It is 300' away from the aquifer protection zone.

IV. OLD BUSINESS.

A. Continuation of Water Study. There was nothing new to report on the Water Study.

V. REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS.

A. Communications. Ms. Heller reported Tom Goodie would like to trap New England cottontails on the Roxbury Road property given to the Town by the state. Ms. Hardy suggested that they contact the First Selectman.

B. Agribusiness Subcommittee.

1. Bike and Barbeque. Mr. Christensen reported there were 235 individuals who attended the Bike and Barbeque on October 1. Five purchased meals and 230 rode bikes. The Lions donated \$630 worth of food. The 62 mile ride was the most popular. Each of the historical homes had approximately twenty visitors. Each had different venues. We paid for three state workers. Even though the weather was not good, everyone who attended enjoyed it.

Mr. Christensen reported Gary Robbins a UCONN Hydrologist will speak on Wednesday October 19 from 6:30 p.m. to 8 p.m. at East Lyme Library Archives Room on well head and aquifer protection. Coffee and cake will be served. We would like to invite Conservation, Selectmen and Planning members.

Agribusiness wishes to promote and preserve farming and educate the Town and Town officials about farming.

At our Agribusiness Subcommittee Meeting we had discussion on manure.

We are working on honeybee regulations.
