CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Carlson called the November 8, 2017 Conservation of Natural Resources Regular Meeting to order at 7 p.m.

Mr. Nichols and Ms. Ashburn were asked to be seated.

I. PUBLIC DELEGATIONS

Mr. Londregan invited Commission Members to a meeting on December 7 at 6 p.m. at Waterford Town Hall at which Army Corps will attend.

Mr. Nichols asked Mr. Londregan to describe his work. Mr. Londregan replied he currently runs the only commercial hatchery in the State of Connecticut. He stated at the present time there are 22 oyster producers in Connecticut. The concept is to take 3/8 seed and grow it to 1 1/2 in the river. The majority will be sold in Connecticut. Mr. Londregan stated he pays for the area by giving a percentage of what he produces to WELSCO. The more shellfish there is the more people will buy permits.

Mr. Londregan stated it is very low density shellfishing. If all the water disappears, then they will see something is in the water. He added when he had to prepare his sounding map, it had to be zero tide which happens seven times a month.

Mr. Christensen added half of the time it is night and doesn't last long.

Mr. Londregan stated he can't touch the mud area. Waterford and East Lyme have put moorings in that area. Mr. Nichols asked if Mr. Londregan is using public trust lands for private use. It is a water dependant use which qualifies for the use of public lands. Mr. Carlson felt it was a natural resources use. He asked if Mr. Londregan was doing anything to damage our resources? Mr. Londregan felt it is a net gain for the environment. All shellfish have to be tested.

Mr. Nichols asked what species do you use? Mr. Londregan replied Niantic Bay scallops.

II. MINUTES

A. Mr. Carlson asked for additions, deletions or corrections to the October 11, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes.

It was felt that the letter from the Agribusiness Subcommittee to Army Corps of Engineers in support of the shellfish enterprise should be attached to the October 11, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes.

Mr. Christensen moved to approve the October 11, 2017 Regular Meeting Minutes of the Conservation of Natural Resources, pending attaching the letter from the Agribusiness Subcommittee to the Army Corps of Engineers supporting the shellfish enterprise. Seconded by Ms. Ashburn. (4-0) Unanimous.

B. Schedule of 2018 Meeting Dates. The Commission reviewed the schedule of 2018 meeting dates.

A. Goodwin Trail. Mr. Carlson reported on November 9, 2017 he will meet with the East Lyme Engineering Department, Gary Goeschel and the contractor regarding water bars.

IV. OLD BUSINESS

- **A.** Continuation of the Water Study. Each Commission member drafted a brief write-up. He asked that Commission members review each of the write-ups and make any edits they feel are necessary. Mr. Carlson will then compile the report.
- **B. Revisit the Aquaculture Issue.** Mr. Carlson asked for a volunteer to write a letter of support to be read at the hearing on this issue. Ms. Asburn and Mr. Christensen agreed to prepare the letter of support.
