He reported we will have new leases for the fishing docks.

The Town received information that the Police Station recently had several inches of water. Mr. Nickerson stated we are looking to find a solution for the Police Station. We have 23 police in Town. Waterford and Stonington who have the same population have 40.

The school projects are on time and on budget.

c.) Facilities request for McCooks pavilion and tent for Bright Music Festival on June 9, 2019 from 12:00-5:00 p.m. Mr. Putnam reported it is during the beach season but he did not see an impact. They expect 200-400 to attend and 100 vehicles. He added Parks and Recreation co-sponsor this event

This event is being done with Lillian's Restaurant and the Black Sheep.

On November 16 there will be an Evening of Miracles at Mohegan Sun there will be a baseball guest speaker in the New Earth Ballroom with a live and Silent Auction. The cost of \$150 includes a three-hour open bar and plated dinner. This is a kid friendly event with \$75 for a ticket for a child 13 and under.

McCook Point Park:

- We issued 4,199 seasonal beach stickers through the office this summer, down 81 from last year.
- Please see preliminary beach report for this summer on separate sheet.
- We concluded with Lifeguards on the main beach Labor Day weekend with guards on Saturday and Sunday. It continues to be a struggle to have coverage with colleges starting before Labor Day and High School sports starting as well. Lifeguarding crew did an excellent job this summer.
- Friday and Wednesday night concerts in the bandshell ended on August 31st both nights were well attended.
- Upcoming events include:

- Back to school family campout and movie night was well attended we had twenty families campout.
- Entire staff did an outstanding job this summer we had very few complaints and new policies implemented on walk in passes was very positive.

Cini Park/Boardwalk:

- Work crew from York Prison cleaned all the plaques on the Boardwalk, materials and lunch was provided by the East Lyme Public Trust Foundation.

Athletic Facilities:

- Work to the new cell tower/lighting is almost complete lights have been tested and are ready for use.
- We hosted the Wesleyan Women's Soccer team for a week pre-season training, also a

- All fall sports are underway, maintenance crew is doing an outstanding job of field prep.

Miscellaneous:

- I CAN BIKE program was again a huge success we had 31 riders and over 45 volunteers.
