Re: Town-Wide Wetlands Permit for Highway Maintenance

Dear Commission Members,

The East Lyme Public Works Department, Highway Department, must conduct regular maintenance along the town owned public right-of-way including the stormwater drainage features. Some of this activity may occur in the upland review areas or in wetlands themselves (with existing infrastructure). We request that the same permitted activities approved in 2006 and since extended, be permitted again.

These activities will be:

- 1. Excavation of accumulated sediment or removal of brush from the inlet and outlet sides of a drainage pipe or bridge.
- 2. Cleaning or reshaping of a man-made drainage ways or sediment basins.
- 3. Installation or repair of a culvert or bridge head or end wall.

Appropriate soil erosion and sediment control measures in accordance with the 2002 Connecticut Guidelines for Soil Erosion and Sediment Control will be implemented as needed.

Within seven days of filing, all applicants before a municipal Zoning Commission, Planning and Zoning Commission, Zoning Board of Appeals or Inland Wetlands Commission for any project located within a public water supply aquifer or watershed area are reguired by Public Act No. 06-53 of the CT General Statutes to notify The Commissioner of Public Health and the project area Water Company of the proposed project by providing the following information.

Sec. 22a-27j. Additional fee for municipal planning, zoning, wetlands and coastal management applications. Noncompliance. (a) Any person, firm or corporation, other than a municipality, making an application for any approval required by chapters 124, 126, 440 and 444 or by regulations adopted pursuant to said chapters shall pay a fee of twenty dollars, in addition to any other fee which may be required, to the municipal agency or legislative body which is authorized to approve the application. On and after October 1, 2009, the fee shall be sixty dollars. Such municipal agency or legislative body shall collect such fees, retaining two dollars of such fee for administrative costs, and shall pay the remainder of such fees quarterly to the Department of Energy and Environmental Protection and the receipts shall be deposited into the General Fund.
