

East Lyme Senior Center ANNUAL REPORT FY21/22

The East Lyme Senior Center is located within the Community Center Complex, housed off of Society Road. It is a designated Focal Point - as approved by Senior Resources Area Agency of Aging for the Area Plan of 2021 – 2024.

The Senior Center continues to explore funding sources for programming and transportation services. For the 12th year in a row, the Senior Center applied for and received the CT Department of Transportation State Matching Grant for Elderly & Disabled Responsive Transportation. The awarding of this grant helps East Lyme residents get to medical appointments located within southern New London County. Wheelchair accessible vehicles as well as cars are available.

The Senior Center applied for the 5310 Grant in the spring of 2021 to replace an aging vehicle. This grant was awarded and the new vehicle was scheduled for delivery in the summer of 2022. However, due to supply chain issues created by the pandemic, the vehicle has not yet been received.

The Dial-a-Ride grant is comprised of 2 sections: mileage reimbursement for a person who provides a medical ride for an enrolled client and the actual provision of rides to medical appointment for enrolled clients. To streamline the registration process, the client is no longer asked to annually complete a registration form so the # of clients registered for the service shows an increase.
