2. PUBLIC DELEGATIONS

a. Asked that the Commission reconsider issuing commercial passes. He stated that it was a benefit for his guests.

Monthly Report April, 2023

Meeting High Demand for Athletic Field Space

Spring is a very busy time on athletic fields with High School, and youth sport league use of fields. All fields are being scheduled and used, with some even being provided for dual usage. Parks staff is concentrating on having fields ready for scheduled games and doing their best to keep up with maintenance at other areas. Due to the shortage of staff, we are prioritizing baseball/softball and lacrosse fields, and maintenance of public restrooms and trash removal. Some parks and public areas are behind in mowing and trimming.

Department Staffing

Program Coordinator, Jack Messina was hired and began working to run all of our recreational and summer programs. Jack has experience with the department, having held several positions in the department over the last several years.

Training of dozens of seasonal staff members who will work at summer camps, beaches, parking lots and parks is in progress with training on topics like CPR, First Aid, Prevention of Sexual Harassment, Bloodborne Pathogens and program specific trainings are being held.

Looking Ahead

The Niantic Bay 10k: Charlies Race is open for registration. The race is on June 9th and volunteers are needed for this event.

The Summer Concert schedule is set and shows will be held Wednesdays and Fridays from June 21st through September 1st.

Planning has begun for Celebrate East Lyme that is scheduled for July 15.

Quotes are being obtained from vendors who can install heating in the restrooms, and others who can connect the restrooms to public sewer for the Hole in the Wall. The goals is to provide year-round restrooms to better serve the public. Funding is coming from ARPA funds.
