 - 14 printers are scheduled for installation in EL police cruisers by a local vendor who will also service the printers.
 - 4 officers passed the test to join the joint East Lyme and Waterford Special Response Team (SRT). The SRT will be activated once Waterford approves the SRT Memo of Understanding between EL and Waterford.
 - Owing to the higher costs of the limited number of police cruisers being produced, no new EL police cars were ordered to meet the department's need for two unmarked vehicles.

 Upcoming events requiring ELPD involvement include the July fireworks off Black Point, July 15 EL Day and fireworks, the August triathalon, and the Montville Centennial Color Guard.

Lt. Jezierski reported:

- New recruits Xu and Kelly are doing well in the Police Academy. Graduation is tentatively scheduled for July 15.
- ELPD earned Tier 1 & 2 accreditation by the Connecticut Officers Standards and Training Council (POST-C) becoming the first southeast CT department to simultaneously achieve both Tiers. Work is already underway for Tier 3 certification with a deadline of 12/31/2026. J. Perkins commended Lt. Jezierski and the department for this outstanding achievement.
