A. Call Regular Meeting to Order

Ms. Hall called for delegations. There were none.

D. Minutes

Regular Meeting – May 10, 2023 Ms. Hall called for a motion for approval or any changes to the Board of Finance Regular Meeting Minutes of May 10, 2023.

**MOTION (1)

Mr. Birmingham moved to approve the Regular Meeting Minutes of May 10, 2023 as presented. Mr. Maxfield seconded the motion. Vote: 5 - 0 - 0. Motion passed.

Special Meeting – May 24, 2023

Ms. Hall called for a motion for approval or any changes to the Board of Finance Special Meeting Minutes of May 24, 2023.

**MOTION (2)

Mr. Birmingham moved to approve the Special Meeting Minutes of May 24, 2023 as presented. Ms. McNamara seconded the motion. Vote: 4 - 0 - 1. Motion passed. Abstained: Mr. DeRosa

D. Reports

- First Selectman
- Mr. Seery reported on the following:

The final draft meeting on the Charter Revision will be on June 21 at 6:30 PM. He noted that at the Public Hearing that people wanted to leave the automatic budget referendum alone.

The I-95 construction project Rte. 161, Exit 74 is underway and they are working during the night on it – sometimes into the morning hours

They came in under budget on the water tank project and were going to have a scallop shell painted on it but found that it violates zoning.

The Niantic Playhouse has been doing well – Murder on the Orient Express has been popular and has kept the downtown busy.

The Middle School graduation is tonight and had to be moved indoors due to the weather.

The NEW Town Hall hours will begin on July 10, 2023 – Monday – Thursday – 8 AM to 5 PM and Fridays 8 AM to 11:30 AM.

The school sports teams have done really well this year.

Board of Ed

Mr. Newton was at the Middle School Graduation.

Finance Director

Mr. Gervais presented his PP presentation report. (See Attached)

F. New Business

a. Suspense List – Tax Collector

Christine Dixon, Tax Collector said that she had provided the listing and that while the taxes are delinquent – they do remain collectible. She noted that two properties at the tax sale did not sell and that the Town remains in possession of them. She added that they have engaged a collection agency to help find the accounts and that when they do and the taxes are collected a 15% charge is added so that there is no cost to the Town for this service.

Ms. Hall asked about asking the abutting property owners if they were interested in those properties. Mr. Seery said that they also have sewer assessments on them and that if they were to consider this they would consult with an attorney.

Mr. Birmingham moved to approve the June 14, 2023, Suspense List in the amount of \$152,190.04. Mr. Maxfield seconded the motion. Vote: 5 - 0 - 0. Motion passed.

**MOTION (6)

Mr. DeRosa resolved that the resolution entitled "Resolution making appropriations aggregating \$2,000,000 for the construction of modifications upgrades and improvements to the East Lyme Water Treatment Plant Projects and authorizing the issuance of \$2,000,000 Bonds of the Town to meet said appropriations and pending the issuance thereof the making of temporary borrowings for such purpose", a copy of which is attached hereto, is hereby adopted and recommended for approval by the legal voters of the Town at Town Meeting. We waive reading the resolution in its entirety as it has been on file with the Town Clerk. Mr. Maxfield seconded the motion.

Mr. North noted that the upgrades that have been done to the system so far will be further augmented by the items here. He also noted the elimination of iron and manganese which was a large aesthetic concern. Vote: 5 - 0 - 0. Motion passed.

e. Special Appropriation - \$1,408,300 – 2023/2024 Acquisition Program

**MOTION (7)

Ms. McNamara resolved that the resolution entitled "Resolution of the Town of East Lyme, Connecticut authorizing the Execution and delivery of an equipment Lease/Purchase agreement and schedules thereto for the acquisition, Purchase, Financing and leasing of certain equipment", a copy of which is attached hereto, is hereby adopted, and recommended for approval by the legal voters of the Town at Town Meeting. We waive reading the resolution in its entirety as it has been on file with the Town Clerk. Mr. DeRosa seconded the motion.

Vote: 5 - 0 - 0. Motion passed.

f. Ratify Transfer - \$32,286 – HVAC Pump Replacement - ELCC **MOTION (8)

Mr. DeRosa moved to approve a transfer of \$32,286 from Town Contingency account #01-01-120-200-500 to HVAC Pump Replacement Account # 32-70-300-500-005 to allow us to replace the air handler at the ELCC. (This requires Town Meeting Approval) Ms. McNamara seconded the motion.

Ms. McNamara seconded the motion.

Mr. Bragaw explained that the CNRE fund has been hit very hard for repair and replacement of systems. This is for a heat pump system at the Senior Center that has been limping along. This is to repair it. He said that he spoke with Mr. Seery and Mr. Gervais who both agreed to use money from contingency to get this done.

Vote: 5 - 0 - 0. Motion passed.

g. Ratify Transfer - \$20,000 - HVAC Renovations - Field Services Building

**MOTION (9)

Mr. Birmingham moved to approve a transfer of \$20,000 from Town Contingency Account #01-01-120-200-300 to PWD upgrade HVAC FSB Account #85-70-007-700-701 to be able to finish the HVAC Renovations project at the Field Services Building. (This requires Town Meeting Approval) Mr. Maxfield seconded the motion.

Mr. Bragaw said that this was tied to the ARP funds – the ventilation system does not work in the 30,000 sq. ft. warehouse where the trucks are stored and are frequently idling – this is a necessity to properly ventilate the warehouse. The \$20,000 will allow them to get the job done. **Vote:** 5 - 0 - 0. Motion passed

h. Appointment of Auditor

**MOTION (10)

Mr. Maxfield moved to approve the appointment of Clifton Larson Allen LLP for the June 30, 20923 Town of East Lyme audit.

Mr. Birmingham seconded the motion.

Mr. Gervais noted that he has heard that some towns have not had any firm bid at all.

Mr. Maxfield noted that a lot of the firms are not doing this work anymore. Vote: 5 - 0 - 0. Motion passed.

G. Unfinished (Old) Business

a. Discussion and possible action – Fund Balance Policy

Mr. Gervais said that he would have a draft for their next meeting and that they could vote in August on it.

J. Adjournment

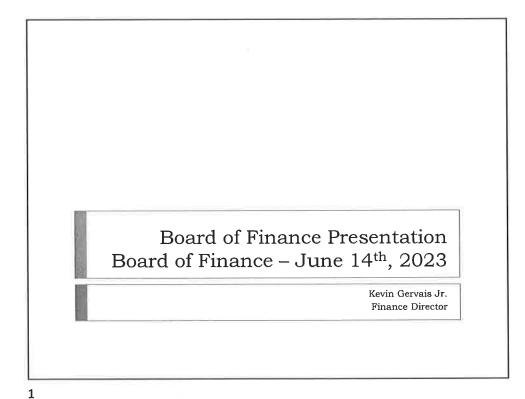

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF EAST LYME, CONNECTICUT AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN EQUIPMENT LEASE/PURCHASE AGREEMENT AND SCHEDULES THERETO FOR THE ACQUISITION, PURCHASE, FINANCING AND LEASING OF CERTAIN EOUIPMENT

WHEREAS, the Town of East Lyme, Connecticut (the "*Town*"), a political subdivision of the State of Connecticut (the "*State*"), is authorized by the laws of the State to purchase, acquire and lease personal property (tangible and intangible) for the benefit of the Town and its inhabitants and to enter into contracts with respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Selectmen of the Town (the "*Board*") has determined that a need exists for the acquisition of certain vehicles and equipment for various departments throughout the Town, as set forth in <u>Schedule A</u> hereto at a cost of not to exceed \$1,408,300 (collectively, the "*Equipment*") on the terms herein provided; and

WHEREAS, in order to acquire such Equipment, the Town proposes to enter into an equipment lease/purchase agreement, including schedules and attachments thereto (the "Agreement"), with a lessor to be determined by a competitive bid process (the "Lessor"); and

WHEREAS, the Board deems it for the benefit of the Town and for the efficient and effective administration thereof to enter into the Agreement for the purchase, acquisition, financing and leasing of the Equipment to be therein described on the terms and conditions herein provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED by the Board as follows:

Section 1. Findings and Determinations. It is hereby found and determined that entering into the Agreement is in the best interests of the Town for the acquisition, purchase, financing and leasing of the Equipment.

Section 2. Appointment of Lessor. The First Selectman, in consultation with the Director of Finance, is authorized to appoint the Lessor after a competitive bid process to select the lowest financing cost from a qualified leasing company.

Section 3. Approval of Documents. The First Selectman is authorized to determine the form, terms and provisions of the Agreement (including the form of any schedule of leased property and rental payments thereto); provided however, that the purchase price of the Equipment shall not exceed \$1,408,300, including financing costs, the term of the Agreement shall not exceed five (5) years. The interest rate included in the lease payments shall be determined by the First Selectman and the Director of Finance. The First Selectman is further authorized to sign and deliver on behalf of the Town the Agreement, any property schedule, any rental payment schedule attached thereto, and any related exhibits attached thereto if and when required.

Section 4. Rent Payments. Any rent payments required under the Agreement shall be appropriated in the Town's annual budget.

Section 5. Other Actions Authorized. The officers and employees of the Town shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the parties to the Agreement to carry out, give effect to and consummate the transactions, contemplated thereby. The First Selectman is authorized to approve and execute and deliver any additional instruments and documents in connection with the Agreement, including, but not limited to, acceptance certificates, escrow agreements, tax certificates, investment agreements, and UCC financing statements creating a security interest in the Equipment in favor of the Lessor, and to take all

action necessary in conformity therewith, including, without limitation, the execution and delivery of any closing and other documents required to be delivered in connection with the Agreement.

Section 6. No General Liability. Nothing contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, any escrow agreement nor any other instrument shall be construed with respect to the Town as incurring a liability or charge upon the general credit of the Town or against its taxing power, nor shall the breach of any agreement contained in this Resolution, the Agreement, any escrow agreement or any other instrument or document executed in connection therewith impose any pecuniary liability upon the Town or any charge upon its general credit or against its taxing power, except to the extent that any rental payments payable under the Agreement are limited obligations of the Town, subject to annual appropriation, as provided in the Agreement.

Section 7. Appointment of Authorized Town Representatives. The First Selectman and the Director of Finance of the Town are each hereby designated to act as authorized representatives of the Town for purposes of the Agreement and other documents executed in connection with the Agreement until such time as the governing body of the Town shall designate any other or different authorized representative for such purposes.

Section 8. Declaration of Official Intent. The Town hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to Section 1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to and any time after the date of passage of this Resolution in the maximum amount of the Equipment with the proceeds of bonds, notes, tax-exempt leases, or other obligations ("Tax Exempt Obligations") authorized to be issued by the Town. The Tax Exempt Obligations shall be issued to reimburse such expenditures not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the Equipment, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The Town hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Director of Finance or his designee is authorized to pay Equipment expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of the Tax Exempt Obligations.

Section 9. Severability. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Resolution.

Section 10. Effective Date. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon its approval and adoption.
