
# TOWN OF EAST LYME BOARD OF POLICE COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING OF JUNE 8, 2023 MINUTES



MEMBERS PRESENT: Dan Price, Regina Hitchery, Mark Powers, Joseph Perkins and Stephen Rebelowski

MEMBERS EXCUSED: Tony Buglione and Giancarlo D'Angelo

ALSO IN ATTENDANCE: First Selectman Kevin Seery, Chief Mike Finkelstein and Lt. Mike Macek

Chairman Price called the meeting to order at 6:02 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

# 2. Delegations

There were none.

# 3. Approval of Minutes

# MOTION (1)

Ms. Hitchery MOVED to approve the regular meeting minutes of May 11, 2023, as submitted. Seconded by Mr. Perkins. IN FAVOR; Price, Hitchery, Powers and Perkins. ABSTAINED; Rebelowski. Motion passed 4-0-1.

# 4a.Golf Carts in Giants Neck Heights

DISCUSSION: Mr. Price explained a little history of this matter, stating that prior to the inception of the Police Commission, the Board of Selectmen were the Legal Traffic Authority for the town. As a regulation that covers public safety, the golf cart regulation should now be removed from the book of town ordinances and will now be maintained by the Local Traffic Authority, which is the Police Commission. The existing maps have been redrawn, with no changes, and the new map for Giants Neck Heights Association has been created and added. Although the golf carts are not allowed to freely drive under the train trestle into Giants Neck, they are permitted to use the drop off at the beach, just as vehicles use it. The Commission discussed the possibility of putting up temporary signage alerting traffic that golf carts are in use and agreed that it would be acceptable as long as it was not permanent signage. The final regulation along with the approved maps are attached as Exhibit #1.

# MOTION (2)

Ms. Hitchery MOVED the following:

RESOLVED, the Police Commission, as the duly authorized traffic authority of the Town of East Lyme, adopts Golf Cart Regulations which govern the use of golf carts on those roads in certain beach communities in town as set forth in the attached Regulation. This regulation takes effect immediately upon its adoption this 8th day of June, 2023 and supersedes East Lyme Golf Cart Ordinance Section 74.01 and 74.99 by operation of state law. Seconded by Ms. Hitchery. Motion passed 5-0.

#### 5. Lieutenants' Reports

#### Lt. Macek reported:

- The bids are out for the new police cruisers; he noted that the base price for said vehicle is up approximately \$9,000 from last year's cost based on the bids that have been received.
- Marine patrol season is underway. The regional boat will be having some minor maintenance work next week, then it should be ready for the season.

# 6. Chief's Report

Chief Finkelstein reported that OSTA (Office of the State Traffic Authority) approved the speed limit reduction to 20 MPH in Attawan Beach, except for West End Avenue, which will remain 25 MPH. OSTA is requiring the town to complete the following actions:

- Install, on stop signs with multiple direction stops, a sign that states "Stop Always".
- Where appropriate add a sign that indicates that "Traffic to the Right Does Not Stop.
- Slow children sign should be removed.
- Add pedestrian warning signs at crosswalks.
- One "Curve Ahead" sign installed.

If the Commission has no comments or issues, the Chief will work with Public Works to complete the items outlined by OSTA in their final report.

Chief reviewed his monthly report, attached hereto as Exhibit #2. He reported:

- The Exit 74 project is going well and communication between the Town, the DOT and the contractors has been great. Very minimal complaints have been received from the public.
- The State is trying out new speed radar enforcement in areas of construction, so there will be speed cameras in our area; recently they were positioned between exits 74 and 75.
- The Memorial Day Parade went well with lots of people downtown. Will be putting more enforcement downtown during the summer season.
- Officers Chen and Kelly are doing really well at the Academy and are scheduled to graduate mid-July.
- There is an open Officer position after receiving a resignation; hiring is difficult at the moment.

## 7. Communications

There was none.

## 8. Chairman's Report

Mr. Price commended Officer VanOverloop on how he handled a recent incident. Chief echoed the sentiment and reported that he concurs and that the officer continues to work with parents and the business closely.

#### 9. Public Comment

There was none.

# 10. Commission Response

Mr. Rebelowski reported on the following:

- He inquired if the digital speed signs can be put on any of the State roads; the answer is no, they are allowed on town roads only.
- East Lyme PBA has discussed disbanding due to lack of participation. This youth group holds numerous fund raisers that benefit the community and would be missed. They will look at options.
- Would like to plan an awards ceremony for the department; everyone was in favor of this and Mr. Price stated that he would work on planning something for the Fin the Fall.

#### 11. Adjournment

MOTION (3)

Mr. Perkins MOVED to adjourn the June 8, 2023, regular meeting of the East Lyme Board of Police Commissioners at 6:36 p.m.

Seconded by Mr. Rebelowski. Motion passed 5-0.






## EAST LYME POLICE COMMISSION GOLF CART REGULATIONS


- (A) Pursuant to the provisions of Conn. Gen. Stat. § 14-300g, as amended, the Police Commission, acting herein as the duly constituted traffic authority of the town, hereby permits the operation of golf carts within the town in accordance with the terms of this regulation.
- (B) Gas or electric powered golf carts permitted on town roads must be equipped with a minimum of four wheels, capable of a maximum speed of no more than 25 miles per hour, capable of transporting no more than four persons and comply with the following standards:
- (1) Equipped with a locking brake, main power switch, head lamp(s), tail/brake lamps, operable horn as defined in Conn. Gen. Stat. § 14-80(e), rear view mirror and seatbelts/passenger safety restraints for rear-facing passengers.
- (2) A flag with a minimum height of 72 inches from the ground and at least one foot above any installed roof shall be placed on the left rear of the golf cart to assist pedestrians and motor vehicle operators in observing the location and operation of a golf cart.
- (3) A valid registration sticker from the Police Department placed in a visible location on the rear of the golf cart.
- (C) Prior to operation of a golf cart the owner shall register it with the Police Department. The Police Department shall prepare a registration form and registration sticker for the registration of golf carts. The registration shall expire on May 31 of each calendar year. The owner of a golf cart shall at all times meet the following standards to obtain and maintain a valid golf cart registration.
- (1) The owner must submit proof of ownership, such as a certificate of title or bill of sale, and a certificate of insurance covering the golf cart that meets the State of Connecticut minimum liability insurance requirements for a motor vehicle or insurance requirements that are established by the Connecticut Department of Motor Vehicle Regulations concerning golf carts upon adoption of same.
  - (2) The golf cart must satisfy the standards of division (B) above.
- (3) The payment of a fee in the amount of \$35 is due for each registration period. From time to time the Police Commission may amend the amount of such fee to an amount sufficient to cover all costs associated with the implementation and enforcement of the requirements of this regulation.
  - (D) The following conditions shall apply to the operation of a golf cart:
- (1) Operators must possess a valid Connecticut motor vehicle operator's license, proof of insurance and a valid golf cart registration.

- (2) All applicable Connecticut and local laws and regulations governing the operation of a motor vehicle, including but not limited to parking rules and regulations, are applicable to the operation of a golf cart.
- (3) Operation of a golf cart shall be permitted only between one-half hour after sunrise and one-half hour prior to sunset.
- (4) Passengers shall be limited to one passenger per seat, with no more than four passengers in a golf cart.
- (E) Golf carts may be operated only on those roads delineated on the maps/plans attached hereto as **Exhibits A-D** and which are located in the following areas of the town:
- (1) The Oak Grove and Crescent Beach communities, those roads delineated on the map/plan attached as **Exhibit A**.
- (2) The Black Point Beach Club Association. Inc. and The Old Black Point communities, those roads delineated on the map/plan attached as **Exhibit B**.
- (3) The Saunders Point community, those roads delineated on the map/plan attached as **Exhibit C**.
- (4) The Giants Neck Heights Community, those roads delineated on the map/plan attached as **Exhibit D**.
- (F) The maps/plans attached as **Exhibits A-D** of Subsection (E) herein shall be filed with the Town Clerk and posted on the Town's website at www.eltownhall.com., and copies thereof available to members of the public.
- (G) Any person who operates a golf cart in violation of any provision of Conn. Gen. Stat. § 14-300g(a), any insurance requirement established in accordance with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 14-300g(b) or any conditions or limitations established by the Police Commission for the operation of golf carts, shall have committed an infraction and will be subject to the same fine structure of motor vehicles as defined in Connecticut General Statues.
