First Selectman's Corner

The crispness of autumn has arrived after a very warm and wet summer. As East Lyme heads into the holiday season there are many great events coming up. On Veterans Day, November 11th, there will be a ceremony at Veteran's Green (Penn Ave and Main St) at 10:00 am. The Holiday Stroll on Main Street will be on Saturday, November 25th, from 3:00 to 7:00 pm with the lighting of the Christmas tree on the green at 5:00 pm. The Niantic Playhouse on Main St will be performing "A Christmas Carol" the first couple of weekends in December. Be sure and go online to check out the exact dates and times of the performances. And the fall season will be capped off by the Light Parade on Saturday, December 9th!

CONSTRUCTION - RT 161/EXIT 74

The first year of construction for the Rt 161/Exit 74 project is just about finished until the spring. The blasting, lane closures, and backups along Rt 161 should be behind the Town until the spring of 2024. If you have not already done so, be sure and sign up for alerts regarding the construction. The alerts will assist in minimizing the inconvenience of traffic backups resulting from the project.

AMTRAK

Regarding the Amtrak fence replacement, it does not look like this project will be undertaken within the next year. Several of Amtrak's fence replacement projects have been delayed for budgetary reasons. The Amtrak representative, who has been very responsive to all inquiries and questions from the Town, has repeatedly stated the Town will

be part of the decision process when the fence is replaced.

MUNICIPAL ELECTION

The municipal election on November 7th will see a new administration elected for the Town. For the last 26 years I have had the distinct honor and privilege of serving the Town of East Lyme -14 on the Board of Education, 10 on the Board of Selectmen, and the last 2 as First Selectman. Superintendent's Note

East Lyme Public Schools continues to thrive and provide an outstanding school experience for every student in our district. We remain proud of our reputation and focus on the needs of 'The Whole Child', including the mental health of our students.


At the start of this school year our district received a three-year grant

from the State of Connecticut for approximately \$320,000 which has allowed us to expand our mental health support for students and hire an additional School Psychologist at the high school level.

Our school district continues to grow and build on our pathway programs and opportunities for students to explore various career options that may be available to them whether or not they attend college. We have received approximately \$130,000 in grant funding and donations to support many of these student programs. Some of these programs include Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) coursework, auto mechanics, aviation mechanics, welding, nursing, cyber security, construction, and early childcare. These are excellent opportunities within and beyond the classroom that are helping our students with expanded career choices.

Another important focus for the district is the ongoing safety and security measures required for students and staff within our building and on school grounds. At the start







of the 2023-2024 school year, we found increased community campus activity that was not associated with our school system, such as community use of the high school track and tennis courts during the school day, along with increased car traffic flow using the high school parking lot as a cut-through between Boston Post Rd. and Rt. 161.

State Statute Sec. 53a-185 requires that anyone on a school campus during the day must have a specific reason associated with a student to be present in a school building or on any school grounds. Hence, for the safety of all we have asked our East Lyme community to help support these safety measures and avoid being on school grounds for any purpose other than it being related to a student. This applies only when school is in session or during scheduled after-school student events and contests.

We appreciate our wonderful town and supportive families and school community. We will continue to ensure the best possible education is provided for every child here in East Lyme. Please join me in thanking every teacher, staff member, and administrator for all their hard work and care for our children. They provide an amazing service through dedication and excellence in education.



The Parks and Recreation Department may also establish minimum or maximum class sizes to ensure appropriate instructor-to-participant ratios.

In person registration is at the Parks and Recreation Department Office in the E. Lyme Library Community Center on Society Road, by mail (Mailing address: 41 Society Rd., Niantic, CT 06357 or online.)

Programs limiting the number of participants will be determined on a first-come-first-served basis. Non-residents will be charged an additional \$15 fee for programs.

Payment must be made in full at the time of registration, without exception. We accept cash, Visa / MasterCard / Discover, and checks made payable to: "The Town of East Lyme." Returned checks will be charged a \$20 fee.

Refund Policy

If a program is cancelled by Parks and Recreation, a full refund will be offered or a credit can be issued to your household account for future programs, events, beach passes, etc. All other refunds will be subject to a \$15.00 processing fee if refund check is to be issued. No fees will be charged if refund is applied to house hold account for future programs, beach passes, etc. (If cancellation is due to medical condition; a doctor's note will be required for fee to be waived.)

All program cancellations due to inclement weather will be announced on local radio stations and local TV channels 3, 8, & 30. If schools close due to weather or other circumstances, then programs held at affected schools will be cancelled. Park and Beach Information

McCook Point Park, Hole N' Wall, & Cini Park:

- Open daily from 8:00 am to sunset
- Pets are permitted on beaches from the Tuesday after Labor Day until the Friday before Memorial Day ONLY**; must be always under owners' control and it is the owner's responsibility to clean-up all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year.
- Once restrooms re-open, they will remain open until mid-November as weather permits.
- Contact the Parks and Recreation Office for Pavilion reservations / availability.
- All East Lyme parks are Tobacco.

State Statute 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.

**NO PETS May 27 - Sept 4, 2023 AT ANY BEACH FACILITY: SEE BELOW REGULATION

State Regulation (Public Swimming Area Regulations) Section 19a-36-B61 (10) states domestic animals shall be prohibited in the water and the land immediately adjacent to the water of a public swimming area when the public swimming area is open for use.

The pavilion and bandshell are available for full day or half day rental (9:00 am to 1:00 pm or 1:30 pm until dusk) during the summer season (Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day) for East Lyme/Niantic residents/taxpayers. 

Unattended Minor Policy (5/7/18) REVISED 3/6/23 TO AGE 12

Although serving children and families is an important part of the library's mission, it is not the Library's function or purpose to supervise or care for minors. Accordingly, the library and its staff cannot, and expressly do not, assume any responsibility to supervise or care for a minor on library premises. Rather, a minor's caregiver (such as a parent, guardian or other person having custody or control, or providing supervision of a minor) is responsible for the supervision, conduct and safety of such minor at all times while on Library premises. Children under the age of twelve, for their safety and well

-being, must be accompanied by a responsible adult while on library premises, although library staff may in its discretion require any minor to be accompanied by a responsible adult or teenager while on library premises.

Library staff members do not monitor children leaving the library. If a child is not able to leave the library unaccompanied by an adult, the child should not be in the library without an adult. For privacy purposes, staff members do not sign in or sign out any library patrons.

Disruptive patrons may be asked

to leave the library or the children's library. Examples of disruptive behavior include but are not limited to the following: swearing or using inappropriate language, yelling, bullying in-person or online, inappropriate public displays of affection, and destruction of library property.

Library staff is not responsible for monitoring computer usage. If a child is old enough to be in the library alone, that child is old enough to follow library internet safety rules and any additional online rules set by the parent(s). Parents alone are responsible for their child's online activities.



CARBON MONOXIDE (CO) POISONING CAN BE PREVENTED!









Can't hear it...

Can't smell it...

Can't see it...

Can't taste it ...

Carbon monoxide (CO) is a colorless, odorless, and tasteless gas that is slightly lighter than air. It is toxic to humans and animals when inhaled in high concentrations. Common sources of carbon monoxide include vehicle exhaust, malfunctioning furnaces, gas stoves, charcoal grills, fireplaces, and tobacco smoke.

How to Recognize CO Poisoning:

- Headache One of the first signs of CO poisoning is a throbbing headache. The headache may come and go or be constant.
- Dizziness Feeling lightheaded or dizzy is a common symptom. The dizziness may be accompanied by loss of balance or vertigo.
- Nausea and vomiting Many people experience nausea and vomiting when exposed to high levels of CO.
- Fatique and weakness Exposure can cause sudden fatique or muscle weakness that improves if you go outside or open a window.
- Shortness of breath CO binds to hemoglobin in the blood, reducing oxygen delivery in the body and potentially leading to breathing difficulties.
- Confusion and impaired thinking High CO levels can impair cognitive function, resulting in confusion, disorientation, hallucinations, and trouble concentrating.
- Loss of consciousness At very high concentrations, CO poisoning can cause fainting or loss of consciousness.
- Cherry red skin In severe cases, the skin may take on a cherry red coloring. This is a late and
- Vision problems Blurred or double vision, reduced visual acuity, and vision loss are possible with CO toxicity.

Pay attention if multiple people in the same enclosed area develop these symptoms at the same time. The symptoms often improve when you move to fresh air. Seek immediate medical attention if you suspect CO poisoning.

Tips to help prevent carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning

- Install CO alarms on every level of the home and near sleeping areas. Check batteries monthly and replace alarms every 5-7 years.
- Have furnaces, water heaters, space heaters, fireplaces, wood stoves, and chimneys professionally inspected and serviced annually. Check that vents and chimneys are not blocked.
- Never use gas ovens or stoves for heating your home.
- Never run a gasoline or propane engine indoors or in an attached garage, even if the garage door is open. This includes vehicles, lawn mowers, generators, etc. OF EAST
- Outdoor vents for clothes dryers, furnaces, and water heaters should be kept clear of snow, leaves, or other debris.
- Avoid using unvented space heaters indoors. If using vented heaters, keep a window slightly open.
- Make sure fireplaces are properly vented and chimneys are clear of debris. Open the flue during use.
- Do not idle your car inside the garage, even with the garage door open.
- RGENCY MANA Install window and attic ventilation fans to avoid buildup of combustion gases. Have your gas appliances routinely inspected and serviced by a certified technician.
- Taking preventative measures can help keep your family safe from the dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning.




native insects, who we rely upon for 1 in every 3 bites of food, do not travel far so their needs for habitat, food and reproduction must be readily available.
