EAST LYME BOARD OF SELECTMEN REGULAR MEETING MINUTES DECEMBER 20, 2023

Mr. Cunningham called the regular meeting of the East Lyme Board of Selectmen to order at 7:00 p.m. and Ms. Hardy led the Pledge of Allegiance.

1b. Additional Agenda & Consent Items

MOTION (1)

Ms. Cicchiello MOVED to add Agenda Item #3e to approve emergency work to be done on the sea wall at McCooks Beach.

Seconded by Ms. Hardy. Motion passed 6-0.

1d. Approve Minutes

Ms. Cicchiello MOVED to approve the regular meeting minutes of December 6, 2023, as submitted.

2b. CTDOT Master Municipal Agreement

DISCUSSION: Mr. Bragaw stated that this document is updated every ten years and there are no items of concern to bring up. Ms. Cicchiello noted that they added Section 4.14 to the documents regarding Affirmative Action goals.

3a. Presentation by Parks and Recreation Re: Darrow Pond
Jerry Lokken, Parks and Recreation Director, and Todd Donovan, Chairman of the Darrow Pond
Subcommittee, gave a summary of how things have progressed at the Darrow Pond property,

and what the findings of the study were as found by FH1 Studio, the landscape architect. Contact the Parks and Recreation office for more information.

3b. 2022 Hazard Mitigation and Climate Adaptation Plan **MOTION (5)**

Ms. Cicchiello MOVED the following:

WHEREAS, the Town of East Lyme has historically experienced severe damage from natural hazards, and it continues to be vulnerable to the effects of those natural hazards profiled in the plan (e.g. flooding, extreme heat, droughts, severe storms such as thunderstorms and winter storms, dam failures, wildfires, and earthquakes) resulting in loss of property and life, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety; and

WHEREAS, the East Lyme Board of Selectmen approved the previous versions of the Hazard Mitigation Plan in 2005, 2012, and 2018; and

WHEREAS, Southeastern Connecticut Council of Governments, of whom the Town of East Lyme is a member, has determined that climate change is affecting the frequency and severity of some hazards and therefore elected to expand the Hazard Mitigation Plan Update to become a Hazard Mitigation and Climate Adaptation Plan Update; and

WHEREAS, committee meetings were held, and public input was sought in 2022 regarding the development and review of the Hazard Mitigation and Climate Adaptation Plan Update; and WHEREAS, the Plan specifically addresses hazard mitigation and climate adaptation strategies and Plan maintenance procedures for the Town of East Lyme; and

WHEREAS, the Plan recommends several hazard mitigation actions that will provide mitigation for specific natural hazards that impact the Town of East Lyme, with the effect of protecting people and property from loss associated with those hazards while adapting to the effects of climate change; and

WHEREAS, Southeastern Connecticut Council of Governments has developed and received conditional approval from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for its Hazard Mitigation and Climate Adaptation Plan Update under the requirements of 44 CFR 201.6; and

WHEREAS, adoption of this Plan will make the Town of East Lyme eligible for funding to alleviate the impacts of future hazards; now therefore be it.

RESOLVED by the Board of Selectmen:

- 1. The Plan is hereby adopted as an official plan of the Town of East Lyme;
- 2. The respective officials identified in the mitigation strategy of the Plan are hereby directed to pursue implementation of the recommended actions assigned to them;
- 3. Future revisions and Plan maintenance required by 44 CFR 201.6 and FEMA are hereby adopted as a part of this resolution for a period of five (5) years from the date of this resolution.

An annual report on the progress of the implementation elements of the Plan shall be presented to the Board of Selectmen.

3e. McCooks Beach Sea Wall

MOTION (14)

Ms. Cicchiello MOVED to approve a special appropriation in the amount of \$25,000 from remaining unexpended American Rescue funds to a new ARPA Account 85-70-008-700-802 "McCooks Beach Seawall" for a temporary fix to prevent further erosion, and forward to the Board of Finance for approval. Note: This requires a town meeting. Seconded by Ms. Carlson. Motion passed 6-0.

4a. Ex-Officio Reports

Mr. Deeble reported:

- Harbor Management Shellfish Commission is applying to place a speed marker south of the bridge.
- Board of Education appointed two new members.

Ms. Carlson reported:

- The Short-Term Rental ad hoc committee met with the Town Attorney present and had a lengthy discussion with many questions asked. The next meeting is scheduled for January 16th, with a public hearing tentatively planned for January 29th.
- Parks and Recreation discussed their budget and appointed two members.

4b. First Selectman's Report

Mr. Cunningham reported:

- Board of Finance appointed Denise Hall as the temporary chairperson.
- Board of Education will begin reporting quarterly to the Board of Finance; currently they report monthly.
- Police Commission discussed that this year's Light Parade had the highest attendance ever, with no mutual aid necessary.
- The new exit 74 northbound ramp is open; this project is just in the beginning stages.
- Our Police Department is the only fully accredited department in Connecticut.
- As First Selectman, he is now Chair of the Water and Sewer Commission.
- The meter replacement project is 96% complete.
- Went to a meet and greet with Warden Sexton and staff at York Correctional Institute.
- They are implementing an aerospace machine shop and will begin producing parts for the industry. They are paid prevailing wages and will keep the job once leaving York CI.

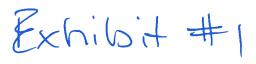
