First Selectman's Corner

Hello all. I hope you had a great holiday season! Thank you for so many kind expressions of welcome and good luck as I step into the office of First Selectman. It is of course a great honor and challenge, to which I am looking forward.

The 35th annual Light Parade on December 9th was the best attended in the event's history. Mild weather contributed to a joyful and robust turnout. Main Steet looked terrific with bright lights and decorated store fronts. There were plenty of choices for those in search of a great meal from one end of Main Street to the other! The floats were amazing as always. There seems to be no end to the creative and festive spirit in East Lyme. This year's new attraction, "Buoys by the Bay," at the Niantic Main Street Park was a big hit. Thank you to the East Lyme Public Trust for organizing this event.

SEAWALL REPAIR AT MCCOOK'S PARK

The seawall at the end of the McCook's Park parking lot, to the right when you enter the park, collapsed onto the beach last month. Two powerful storms snuck through Fishers Island Sound to attack our beach and wash out the wall. Quick action by the Department of Public Works secured the area with the completion of a substantial temporary seawall. Large interlocking cement blocks (Legos for Adults) were arranged and situated in such a way that wave action will not be able to get beneath the wall to undermine the repair. This wall should protect the parking lot from further damage and erosion while funding is arranged, and plans are completed for a permanent repair.

ROUTE 161 / EXIT 74

Construction on the Route 161 / Exit 74 project continues to move forward. Mild weather has allowed for good progress so far this winter. There were



CT DEEP SAFE BOATING COURSES

Recreational boaters using Connecticut's waterways are required to have either a Safe Boating Certificate (SBC) or a Certificate of Personal Watercraft Operation (CPWO) to operate a boat in Connecticut. A Safe Boating Certificate permits an individual to operate any recreational vessel, except for a personal watercraft, on Connecticut's waters. A Certificate of Personal Watercraft Operation allows an individual to operate any recreational vessel, including a personal watercraft, such as a "Jet Ski." When operating a vessel, you must have your certificate on board at all times.

The Parks and Recreation Department will be hosting combination classes in May for participants to receive both their SBC and CPWO with successful completion.

The East Lyme Parks and Recreation Department reserves the right to reschedule, relocate, or cancel any announced program due to facility availability and public response. The Parks and Recreation Department may also establish minimum or maximum class sizes to ensure appropriate instructor-to-participant ratios.

Monday - Friday | 8:00 am - 4:00 pm

Directions

95 South - Take Exit 74; turn right onto Flanders Rd (CT-161) & continue for approx. 1 mile. Turn right at stop light onto Society Rd. (*Clauson Nursery is on corner.*) Turn right immediately after Lillie B. Haynes School, following signs to East Lyme Library / Community Center (*complex will be on left.*) The Parks & Recreation Office is located in Community Center complex.

95 North - Take Exit 73; turn left onto Society Road. Follow road until 3-way stop sign. Bear left onto Society Rd. and follow to Lillie B. Haynes School; take Left (*see above*.) register for programs.

In person registration is at the Parks and Recreation Department Office in the E. Lyme Library Community Center on Society Road, by mail (**Mailing address:** 41 Society Rd., Niantic, CT 06357 or online.)

Programs limiting the number of participants will be determined on a firstcome-first-served basis. Non-residents will be charged an additional \$15 fee for programs.

Payment

Payment must be made in full at the time of registration, without exception. We accept cash, Visa / MasterCard / Discover, and checks made payable to: "The Town of East Lyme." Returned checks will be charged a \$20 fee.

Refund Policy

If a program is cancelled by Parks and Recreation, a full refund will be offered or a credit can be issued to your household account for future programs, events, beach passes, etc. All other refunds will be subject to a \$15.00 processing fee if refund check is to be issued. No fees will be charged if refund is applied to house hold account for future programs, beach passes, etc.

(If cancellation is due to medical condition; a doctor's note will be required for fee to be waived.)

Cancellations

All program cancellations due to inclement weather will be announced on local radio stations and local TV channels 3, 8, & 30. If schools close due to weather or other circumstances, then programs held at affected schools will be cancelled.

The Parks & Recreation Department makes every effort to have programs and facilities that are appropriate and accessible for all ages and abilities and seeks to ensure that all programs and activities are available to East Lyme residents with physical and mental disabilities. We provide accommodations when necessary to allow your participation.

Park & Beach Information

McCook Point Park, Hole N' Wall, & Cini Park:

- Open daily from 8:00 am to sunset
- Pets are permitted on beaches from the Tuesday after Labor Day until the Friday before Memorial Day ONLY**; must be always under owners' control and it is the owner's responsibility to clean-up all pet waste. Dogs are not permitted on the Niantic Bay Boardwalk at any time during the year.
- Once restrooms re-open, they will remain open until mid-November as weather permits.



- Contact the Parks and Recreation Office for Pavilion reservations / availability.
- All East Lyme parks are Tobacco.

State Statute 22-364 states that dogs must be under the direct control of their owners at all times when using town parks. It is the dog owner's responsibility to clean up all dog waste.


BEACH PASSES 2024

East Lyme Public Trust Foundation **Monitoring Sand Dynamics at Niantic Bay Beach**

On October 6, 2023, the E.L. Public Trust Foundation arranged to have Gerwick-Mereen LLLC conduct a high-resolution topographic sand survey to determine if there has been any significant loss of sand from Niantic Bay Beach due to erosion. This study was co-funded by the East Lyme Public Trust Foundation and the East Lyme Parks and Recreation Department.

On December 6, 2023, the team of Dr. Frank Bohlen- UCONN, Marine Sciences Department, the surveyors-Gerwick-Mereen, Jim Gallagher of the E.L.P.T.F. and Jerry Lokken-Director of the East Lyme Parks and Recreation Department, analyzed the graphic charts that Gerwick-Mereen had produced. This data revealed that a small loss of sand has been occurring at the western shoreline of the beach, while a small accumulation of sand has been taking place in the beach interior and in the eastern portion of the shoreline.

In 2014, Dr. Frank Bohlen, UCONN, Marine Sciences Department, had recommended that the Foundation consider monitoring the sand movement at the newly sand reinforced Niantic Bay Beach, running along the Niantic Boardwalk. This newly formed beach consisted of approximately



70,000 cubic feet of sand, transported from Canterbury, CT.

Yearly, for the next five years, the Foundation and the Parks Department hired Gerwick-Mereen LLC to conduct a high resolution combined multinational GPS derived topographic of the beach. The co-operating agencies then decided to continue the survey project to collect additional data.

After a three-year hiatus, the second phase of the survey took place in October, 2023. Overall, the data from 2019 and 2023 are encouraging, with only slight changes in either loss or accumulation levels. Overall, the data from 2019 and 2023 show that the

beach seems to have reached a stable condition. The Analysis team has not yet decided if additional consecutive annual surveys will be required.

The Foundation and the Parks Department will continue to monitor this situation to ensure that there is no significant loss of sand which would be deleterious to the beach's recreational and ecological values.

Ice Safety Tips

With winter here, many of us enjoy outdoor activities like ice skating, hockey, and ice fishing. But before heading out onto frozen lakes and ponds, it's crucial to assess the ice conditions for your safety.

New ice is weaker than old ice. Clear ice that is 4 inches thick may be safe for walking, while 5-6 inches may hold snowmobiles. However, ice does not freeze uniformly - it may be several inches thick in one spot but dangerously thin just feet away. Insulating snow also slows the freezing process. Avoid ice formed over moving water, currents, springs and inlets, as the motion weakens the ice.

While booming and cracking ice is not necessarily dangerous, avoid areas with cracks, water on top, or bluish tint indicating thin ice. Check thickness yourself using an ice auger to drill test holes as you go. **Follow general guidelines**: 2 inches or less - STAY OFF. 4 inches ice fishing or other activities on foot.



NOTE: It is illegal to drive a car or truck on the ice in Connecticut.

5-7 inches - snowmobile or ATV.

When heading out, tell someone your plans and carry a cell phone and ice safety kit: rope, ice picks, whistle and spiked shoes. Should you fall in, don't panic. Turn toward the direction you came from and place your hands and arms on the unbroken surface. Kick your legs to push your body onto the solid ice. Lie flat and roll away to safer ice. Get to a warm, dry, sheltered area immediately and remove wet clothes to rewarm. If someone else falls in, remember "reach, throw, don't go." Call 911 then lie down to reach with a branch, rope, or ladder to the victim. Throw a flotation device or life jacket secured to a rope. Only go out onto unsafe ice as a last resort, using a human chain or rope tied to shore.



Using proper judgment, you can enjoy the ice safely. But remember, if in doubt, stay off the ice! Take and put safety first this winter

- Dry flood proof the building so water cannot get into it;
- Wet flood proof portions of the building so water won't cause damage;
- Construct a berm or redirect drainage away from the building;

• Maintain nearby streams, ditches, and storm drains so debris does not obstruct them; and

• Correct sewer backup problems.

There are several qualified people at the Town of East Lyme that can talk to you about flood hazard, flood protection measures, and/or possible financial assistance.

- Elevate the building above the flood level;




East Lyme Veterans
