


- 06/04/24 Community outreach, ACO gives talk to the Waterford LEO club students, an auxiliary group of the Waterford Lions club, regarding the duties and responsibilities of Animal Control, this is a very respectful, and community committed group of high school students.
- 2) 06/05/24 AACO Ryans dog PERCY has been appointed as the official comfort / therapy dog for the East Lyme Police Department, they will be completing some training and will be available for civic events and emergency situations as needed. Much like HODGES does at Waterford PD



3) 06/14/24 responded to a dog bite incident where a homeowner was severely bitten by her own dog while trying to break up a dog fight, dog was a 120 pound mastiff, dog was severely injured in fight as well, owner elected to euthanize the dog immediately rather than treat its injuries, quarantine it for 10 days and then euthanize it. ACO had to capture and move the very angry dog on a catch pole, which is made of aluminum and was actually bending like a deep sea fishing pole while the dog fought against it. Thankfully with the assistance of two Police Officers, we were able to secure the dog and transport him to the vet. Because the dog was not going to complete a quarantine period, the dog had to be decapitated and his head sent to the state lab for rabies testing, thankfully, the dog tested negative for rabies.



4) 6/24/24 community outreach, ACO's and Percy attended the coffee with a cop event at the Waterford Library.



5) 6/26/24 Community outreach, ACOs and Percy were invited to the Sweet Serenity camp to give a talk about Animal Control Officers and what we do to help the animals, as is usually the case, Percy was the star of the show.



6) 6/29/24 In conjunction with the New London animal control, your ACO's hosted the first pasta/potato salad contest at bates woods park. The concept is similar to a chili cook-off, but participants made pasta salad and potato salad entries, using donations from the community, we purchased burgers and dogs and other supplies. Citizens could come purchase a ticket and get a burger, drink, chips and the opportunity to sample and vote on their favorite salad. We had trophies for the winners, a band came down to play music and with volunteers and the ACO's, we raised \$3100.00, which split between us, gave each agency \$1550.00 which will be applied to our non-emergency vet funds. With these funds at the vet offices, we have the opportunity to pay for medical care for the animals above and beyond what the towns are willing to pay. Sometimes an x-ray or blood test makes a huge difference. Sometimes a rabies shot gives a dog the opportunity to get out and meet people, increasing his chances for adoption.


