

- 2) The lone New London Animal Control Officer went on a week's long vacation. They have not yet hired a second ACO. Your Animal Control Officers covered emergency calls in New London and fed and cared for all their animals at the shelter during this time.
- 3) 08/11/25 Amtrak conductor reports possibly striking a dog on the tracks, we walked almost 3 miles of tracks on the area and were unable to locate any dogs.



4) 08/12/25 for an unknown reason, DEEP officers collected the remains of a dead deer and sent it for testing, the deer tested positive for rabies. To our knowledge this animal had no contact with humans or domestic animals.
