1. PRELIMINARY BUSINESS

a. Pledge of Allegiance. The Pledge of Allegiance was observed.

Chairman Bekech called the November 10, 2025 Commission on Aging Regular Meeting to order at 5:03 p.m.

3.OLD BUSINESS

- **a.** Special Project Update. Ms. Caramanica reported handicapped bathroom doors have been installed, new chairs will be delivered on Wednesday, and the tables will be received on December 3. We have no date for the rugs. Pictures from the painting group, as well as the drawing group will be hung in the Day Room.
- b. Budget Prep for FY 26/27. Ms. Caramanica asked if any commission member would like to see changes or additions to the budget as presented. Mr. Bekech stated we are in good shape.
