
### **ADA PROJECT AT TOWN HALL**

holidays! The Parks and Recreation Department partners with Niantic Main Street and other community partners to provide the 37th Annual Niantic Light Parade, the 22nd Annual Holiday Stroll and the Magic Show with Santa. We will be decorating downtown Niantic for the Holidays and look forward to seeing "Buoys by the Bay," at Scheer Park again this year. The East Lyme Public Trust, Niantic Main Street, and scores of local artists partner with us for this unique display that brings scores of visitors to downtown Niantic!

Our Parks crew continues to provide well-maintained facilities throughout the year. Right now, soccer, football, baseball and softball teams are actively using our facilities, the pickleball courts are in constant use, and everyday hundreds of people enjoy the Niantic Bay Boardwalk and

beaches. Already this year, we've sealed cracks and repainted the Peretz Park parking lot, reconditioned the irrigation well at Peretz Park to keep our fields in top shape, and made repairs to the Niantic River Walkway where it was damaged by a vehicle. Looking ahead, the department is renovating the baseball field at Peretz Park, installing erosion control features at McCook Point Park, and completing a plan to improve trails at Darrow Pond. We've also got a group working hard to make a dog park in town a reality by obtaining zoning approval and fundraising.





The East Lyme Parks and Recreation
Department reserves the right to reschedule, relocate, or cancel any announced program due to facility availability and public response. The Parks and Recreation Department may also establish minimum or maximum class sizes to ensure appropriate instructor-to-participant ratios.

### **Program Registration Hours:**

Monday - Friday | 8:00 am - 4:00 pm

# **DIRECTIONS**

95 South - Take Exit 74; turn right onto Flanders Rd (CT-161) & continue for approx. 1 mile. Turn right at stop light onto Society Rd. (Clauson Nursery is on corner.) Turn right immediately after Lillie B. Haynes School, following signs to East Lyme Library / Community Center (complex will be on left.) The Parks & Recreation Office is located in Community Center complex.

**95 North** - Take Exit 73; turn left onto Society Road. Follow road until 3-way stop sign. Bear left onto Society Rd. and follow to Lillie B. Haynes School; take Left (*see above*.) register for programs.

In person registration is at the Parks and Recreation Department Office in the East

Lyme Library Community Center on Society Road, by mail (**Mailing address:** 41 Society Rd., Niantic, CT 06357 or online.)

Programs limiting the number of participants will be determined on a first-come-first-served basis. Non-residents will be charged an additional \$15 fee for programs.

### **PAYMENT**

Payment must be made in full at the time of registration, without exception. We accept cash, Visa / MasterCard / Discover, and checks made payable to: "The Town of East Lyme." Returned checks will be charged a \$20 fee.

### **REFUND POLICY**

If a program is cancelled by Parks and Recreation, a full refund will be offered or a credit can be issued to your house-hold account for future programs, events, beach passes, etc.

All other refunds will be subject to a \$15.00 processing fee if refund check is to be issued. No fees will be charged if refund is applied to house hold account for future programs, beach passes, etc.

(If cancellation is due to medical condition; a doctor's note will be required for fee to be

waived.)

### **CANCELLATIONS**

All program cancellations due to inclement weather will be announced on local radio stations and local TV channels 3, 8, & 30. If schools close due to weather or other circumstances, then programs held at affected schools will be cancelled.

# **Assessor's Corner**

# SENIOR HOMEOWNER, DISABLED & VETERANS' TAX RELIEF

A tax relief program for older adults and totally disabled persons who meet certain income requirement as approved by the State of Connecticut. You are applying for a credit on the taxes due on your primary residence in East Lyme.

The new income limit, including TOTAL GROSS income and Social Security should be available on/about January 1, 2026. For further information, contact the Assessor's Office at the Town Hall.

A complete copy of the 2025 IRS return must be submitted at the time of application with a copy of the Social Security 1099. If no IRS return was filed, then all 1099 forms and all income for the year must be presented. Veteran pension and veteran disability payments are included as income for this program. Anyone filing under totally disabled must submit proof of disability, i.e., an original award letter from Social Security and/or a current status report from Social Security as well as all income.

The homeowner must be at least 65 years of age as of December 31, 2025 or be receiving 100% disability benefits from Social Security.

The homeowner must occupy the property as their principal residence and not be receiving tax relief benefits as a homeowner in any other town or state.

# PERMANENTLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED VETERAN 100% SERVICE-CONNECTED DISABILITY RATING TAX EXEMPTION

Effective October 1, 2025, pursuant to Section 12-93 of the Connecticut General Statutes as amended by Public Act 25-168 Section 235, permanently and totally disabled veterans with a 100% service-connected disability rating must file an application form (D-2) annually with the Assessor's Office no later than January 1, 2026. This application shall include (1) all documentation necessary to demonstrate that the veteran has been determined by the United States Department of Veterans Affairs to be permanently and totally disabled based on a service-connected disability rating of one hundred percent (100%), and (2) an attestation that such claimant has not submitted, and will not submit, a claim for the exemption in another town.

# **FLOOD FACTS: DRAINAGE SYSTEM MAINTENANCE**

The Town of East Lyme is a participant in FEMA's Community Rating System (CRS) program, which entitles its residents to discounts on their flood insurance policies. One of the objectives of CRS is to encourage and recognize programs that preserve & restore the natural functions of floodplains and minimize damage & disruption to infrastructure & critical facilities.

#### **KNOW YOUR FLOOD HAZARD**

In the Town of East Lyme, one of the primary threats of flooding results from the "ponding" of water during heavy storms. Some flooding can result from small ditches and streams overflowing during significant storm events. Many local urban flood problems are caused when trash, yard waste, brush, fill or other debris is dumped into channels. This debris can clog storm drains & culverts, divert flows, and reduce the conveyance capacity of channels.

# STREAM DUMPING REGULATIONS

The house you flood may be your own! Don't dump or throw anything into drainage ditches or streams. Obstruction and pollution of our waterways and ditches is a violation of Town Ordinances and Regulations.

Dumping or disposal of debris throughout East Lyme's drainage system is prohibited. A Town Ordinance regulating the disposal of solid waste indicates that no person shall throw or deposit any refuse in any stream or other body of water. According to the East Lyme Inland Wetlands and Watercourses Regulations, filling or depositing material within 300 feet of a wetland or watercourse is considered a Regulated Activity.

The regulations that prohibit disposal of debris in East Lyme's drainage system are enforced throughout the entire community. The Wetlands Enforcement Officer (860)691-4105 and the Town Engineer (860)691-4112 are responsible for receiving complaints and monitoring compliance.











# **East Lyme Veterans**

In October 2013 the State of Connecticut established a Veterans Representative volunteer position in each town to help connect local veterans to resources, services, organizations, and events. The Town of East Lyme is fortunate to have Brian Burridge as our community's Veterans Representative.

The East Lyme Veterans Coffeehouse is held every 2nd Wednesday of the month at VFW Post 5849, 39 Columbus Avenue, Niantic from 6:00 pm to 8 pm and the New London Veterans Coffeehouse is held on the first Friday of each month at the New London Senior Center, 120 Broad Street, in the Library from 9:00 -11:00 am.

The mission is to provide a comfortable location for veterans, both men and women of all ages; to meet, socialize, and receive information regarding veteran benefits through state and federal agencies and organizations.

# New in Town!



Jerrica Watrous, the founder of The Music Studio, displayed her deep passion for music right from the early years. "My grandmother bought me a toy piano when I was four years old," Watrous relates. "I would play and sing all the time. Then she bought me a real piano and I started taking lessons. I always loved piano and singing." Watrous became a classically trained lyric soprano. She then taught piano and voice lessons privately from her home before stepping away from music education to raise a family. When she became an empty nester, the pull of music was just too much.

Watrous wanted a hobby to fulfill her passion for music. So, eight years ago, she rented a small space in Old Mystic. She never expected that the empty room with a

piano and no students would transform into a full-time career with a thriving musical community. This year, Watrous took another leap of faith and opened her second Studio location in Niantic.

The Studio's facilities boast highly trained, passionate musicians who train a wide variety of instruments: piano, voice, guitar, violin, cello, harp, ukelele, flute, and saxophone. Every teacher is hand-selected not only for their talent but also for their ability to inspire. "Our students don't just learn notes," Watrous explains. "They become musicians."

Watrous is so proud of her students (they start at 4 years old, and some are in their

80's). She finds joy in watching them transform from shy and sensitive individuals to confident, expressive musicians. Watrous recounts the story of one 12-year-old student. "I heard something in her voice. I told her she was a true mezzo soprano," she recalls. "She said to me, 'No way." The girl was more interested in pop music. But Watrous continued to work with her and the student now trains at the Hart School as a mezzo soprano. The two still get together over music.

The Studio's focus on music education also includes a commitment to performance - offering numerous performance opportunities throughout the year (from holiday caroling to seasonal recitals to community events). Many students transition into performers at places like the Goodspeed Opera House, Providence Performing Arts Center, Trinity Rep, and more. Just as meaningful are the smaller successes like the child who overcomes stage fright to sing in front of an audience for the first time. "Every story matters," explains Watrous. "Every student's journey is celebrated."






