Presentation to Dr. John Sullivan Interim Principal of East Lyme High School

3. <u>Discussion/action re: Proposed Adoption of Draft 2010-2011 ELPS Calendar</u>

The proposed draft calendar was posted on the district website for public comment and is recommended for adoption by the EL BOE Academics, Athletics and Activities Committee. Child care will be provided at no cost to parents for the five PD ½ days. Elementary principals and the Report Card Foundation Committee agree that the April conferences provide important information to parents regarding student growth and planning for the next school year. Teachers are in contact throughout the year with parents of those students experiencing difficulties.

4. <u>Discussion re: Proposed Superintendent's Recommendation for Phase II Race to the Top (RTTT)</u>
Application

Dr. Lombardo presented information and the timeline for Phase II of Race to the Top. Dr. Lombardo recommended that both the Board of Education and the East Lyme Teachers' Association do not proceed further with the RTTT application and suggested they do not sign the Memorandum of Understanding agreement that is due May 19, 2010. The consensus of the Superintendent and the Board was that the RTTT direction is not appropriate for East Lyme Public Schools and the monetary resources that the District would be need to allocate for the required attendance at workshops and meetings, along with the assignment of an RTTT point person, would far surpass the \$48, 358.00 (based on Title I) that the District would receive per year for four years. No action was required.

5. Discussion re: Superintendent's Recommendation for Physical Education Program Grant
Dr. Lombardo informed the Board of his endorsement of the District PE Department's efforts in applying for a federal grant from the Carol M. White Physical Education Program sponsored by the Department of Education and the Office of Safe and Drug Free Schools. Lisa Kriger (ELMS PE Teacher) and Amy Fabry (ELHS PE Teacher) were available for questions and noted that the awards will range from \$100,000.00 to \$500,000.000. As part of the application process, height and weight of students, without names, will need to be submitted. Parents will have the option to have their child not participate in the data collection. No action was required.

Dr. Lombardo commended and thanked the administrative assistants for working with the Board of Education on ratification of their contract. He also thanked them for not taking a salary increase for 2010-2011 and recommended the suggested modifications to their contract. Tim Hagen thanked the Administrative Assistants on behalf of the Board of Education.

Kathleen has demonstrated through action, philosophy and speech a dedication to the goals and principles of the media profession.
 - 2. The Chinese School will hold their language and cultural classes at ELHS next year each Sunday. The fees will cover all ELPS out-of-pocket costs. The Chinese School will provide language instruction opportunities to ELPS students on Sundays and may perhaps provide additional instruction during the school week. This partnership will provide a unique opportunity for ELPS students at no cost to the District or to the parents of students.
